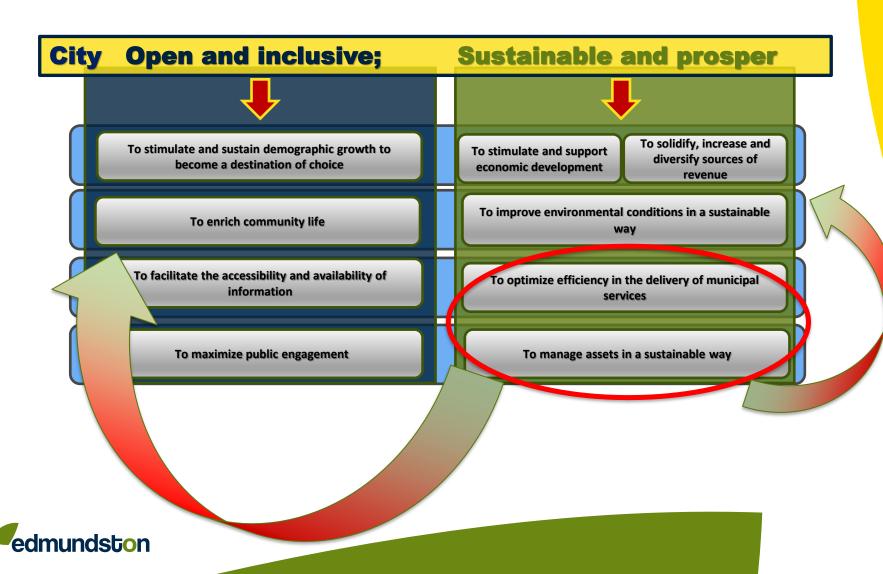
INTRODUCTION

- The City of Edmundston plans to invest more than 9.6 million dollars for capital projects in 2024.
- Funding sources are varied, and some are conditional: operating funds, loans, provincial and federal government contributions or other various agreements.

Context

- An investment plan that focuses on diligent management of aging assets
- Business as usual
 - Sound debt/borrowing management
 - Borrowing of \$2.5 million per year for the general operating fund demonstrated the downward trend in the debt ratio (and supported by various grants).
- Canada Community Development Fund (CCDF formerly Gas Tax) program, currently unknown
 - No FDCC program amount in the plans for 2024
- \$5 million contribution from operating budgets (all funds combined)

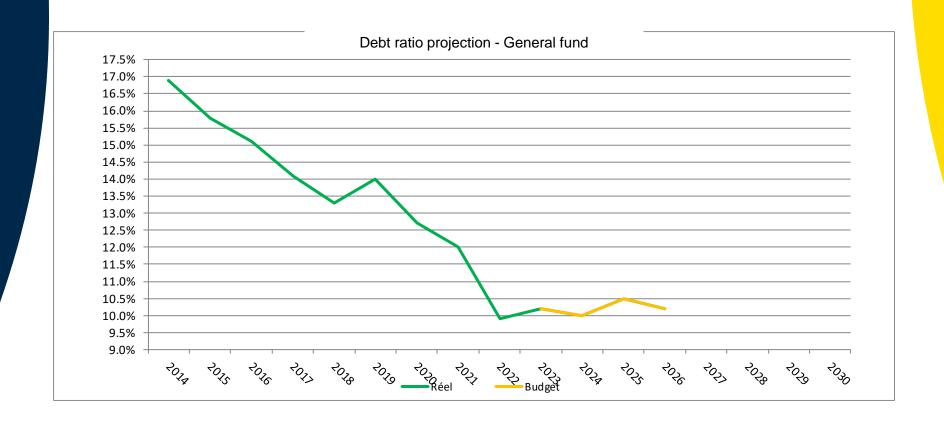

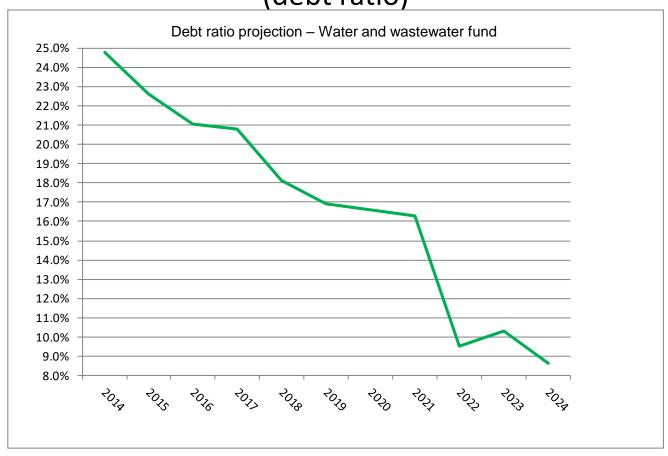

(debt ratio)





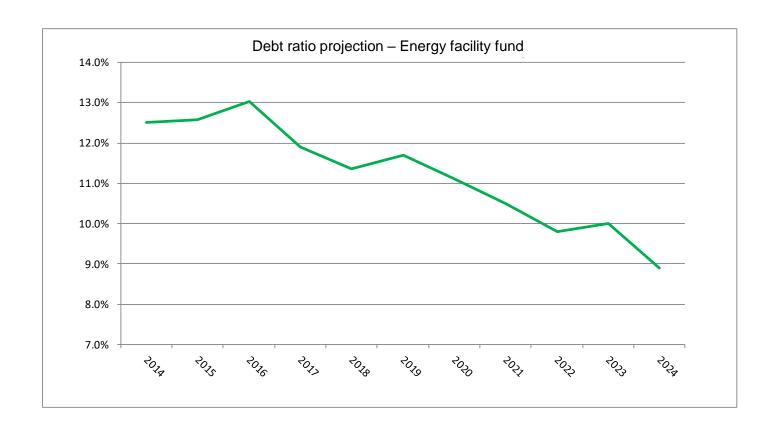
